

Patients to Benefit From Strep Throat Testing and Ear Infection Assessments

Families around the province now have another option to get tested and treated for strep throat and ear infections. The Government of Saskatchewan is launching new services in multiple communities across Saskatchewan, allowing pharmacists to provide one-stop testing for strep throat and ear infections. They will also be able to prescribe and dispense medication to treat those conditions as needed.

Eleven pharmacies have been selected to conduct testing for strep throat and assessment for ear infections, while another 37 sites have been chosen to offer ear infection assessments only. "We are pleased to launch this project, one of the first in Canada, which allows pharmacists the ability to offer patients greater access to health care services by

providing testing and treatment in one visit," Rural and Remote Health Minister Lori Carr said. "With this expanded scope of practice, pharmacists can make greater use of their skills and education, directly benefiting Saskatchewan residents."

SASKATCHEWAN PROCLAIMS FAMILY LITERACY WEEK



The Government of Saskatchewan, in collaboration with the Saskatchewan Literacy Network (SLN) and Family Literacy Hubs, is pleased to proclaim January 27, 2025, as Family Literacy Day and January 25 to 31, 2025, as Family Literacy Week. This annual initiative highlights the importance of literacy in everyday family life.

"Family literacy is fundamental to developing strong language and communication skills in our children and helps increase the quality of life and success in education," Education Minister Everett Hindley said. "This week provides an opportunity for families to explore the many ways literacy can be incorporated into daily activities."

In 2024-25, the government has allocated more than \$1.1 million for literacy initiatives, which includes \$593,000 to support family literacy programming for nine Family Literacy Hubs around the province. The hubs work to raise literacy levels by

increasing public awareness of family literacy and developing sustainable and quality family literacy programs together with community organizations.

RETAIL TRADE REMAINS STRONG IN SASKATCHEWAN



Latest data released by Statistics Canada shows retail trade sales in the province increased by 5.1 per cent from November 2023 to November 2024 (seasonally adjusted), reaching \$2.2 billion. This ranks second in terms of percentage change among the provinces.

• April 7: All parks with seasonal camp sites available.

- April 9: Break;
- April 10: Buffalo Pound, Bronson Forest, Duck Mountain, Moose Mountain, Porcupine Hills;
- April 11: Danielson, Great Blue Heron, Greenwater Lake, Rowan's Ravine, The Battlefords;
- April 14: Douglas, Echo Valley, Makwa Lake, Narrow Hills, Pike Lake; and
- April 15: Blackstrap, Fort Carlton, Crooked Lake, Cypress Hills, Lac La Ronge.

Reservations will begin at 7:00 a.m. CST each day.

INVESTMENT IN BUILDING CONSTRUCTION INVESTMENT SOARS IN SASKATCHEWAN



Province Ranks Second in the Nation for Month-Over-Month Growth

New Statistics Canada data shows a 5.7 per cent increase in Saskatchewan's building construction investment in November 2024 compared to October 2024 (seasonally adjusted). This positions the province as second among all provinces for month-over-month growth in this category.



The province also saw an 11.8 per cent increase in year-over-year construction investment from November 2023 to November 2024.

"These figures reflect the ongoing confidence people and businesses have in making long term investments in Saskatchewan as a place to grow and succeed," Trade and Export Development Minister Warren Kaeding said. "Increased investment in building construction strengthens our communities, supports job creation, and further positions our province as the best place to live, work, and raise a family in the nation."

MORE OPPORTUNITY FOR SASKATCHEWAN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS IN THE OIL & GAS INDUSTRY



Three additional energy companies are partnering with Saskatchewan Distance Learning Centre (Sask DLC) and Teine Energy to support the creation of new online oil and gas high school courses with work placements.

Cenovus Energy, Vermilion Energy and Whitecap Resources have joined Teine Energy's commitment to provide support and industry expertise to Sask DLC's development of new Energy and Mines - Oil & Gas 20 and 30-level online courses.

The four energy companies, each with operations in the province, are providing a combined total of up to \$160,000 over two years to support the creation of the new courses and to fund a coordinator position to facilitate student work placements and industry engagement opportunities.

"The energy sector is an important part of our province's strong and growing

economy - both locally and globally," Minister Responsible for Sask DLC Everett Hindley said. "It is exciting to see Saskatchewan students will be able to learn about the career opportunities that exist here in our province and gain the skills and knowledge they need to have a successful future in the oil and gas industry."

SASKATCHEWAN TECHNOLOGY FUND SEE DOUBLE THE FUNDING FOR SECOND INTAKE



The Government of Saskatchewan is excited to announce the second intake of the Technology Fund, with more than \$50 million available to help Saskatchewan industries reduce their greenhouse gas emissions.

"On the heels of the success of the first intake, I am proud to announce that the second intake of the Saskatchewan Technology Fund will see double the amount of funding available," Environment Minister Travis Keisig said. "This significant increase reflects our government's dedication to supporting Saskatchewan industries as they lead the way in emissions reduction and innovation."

During the first intake, the Technology Fund provided more than \$25 million to 13 projects, which are projected to reduce more than 4.5 million tonnes of CO2e emissions, attract approximately \$277 million in private-sector investment, and unlock nearly five million gigajoules of energy savings. Successful proposals from the first intake included projects from Whitecap Resources Inc. and Batex.




