More students can now train to become Medical Laboratory Technologists (MLT) and Medical Radiologic Technologists (MRT) at Saskatchewan Polytechnic this fall.

The Government of Saskatchewan has provided funding for 10 additional MLT seats and eight additional MRT seats in Saskatoon to help meet the need for these specialized services.



"Expanded training opportunities will help more students find rewarding health care careers right here in Saskatchewan," Advanced Education Minister Gordon Wyant said. "Our government continues to work with post-secondary institutions to support students who want to train for these in-demand careers in our growing province."

MORE STUDENTS CHOOSING USASK



The [University of Saskatchewan](#) achieved record enrolment this fall welcoming students from around the world to campus!

More students are choosing USask to learn, to grow as leaders, and to make new knowledge as innovators and researchers.

As of the first day of classes, on Wednesday, Sept. 6, enrolment at the University of Saskatchewan has increased by almost three per cent [compared to the first day of fall classes last year](#).

Included in that is a 1.8 per cent increase in self-declared Indigenous students, as well as a six per cent increase in international student enrolment. The number of new students beginning their studies at USask has also increased by nine per cent compared to last year.

“It’s great to see more students choosing USask,” said Dr. Jerome Cranston (PhD), vice-provost, students and learning. “We are committed to creating a teaching and learning environment that is welcoming and inclusive so all students can succeed academically and socially.”

CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF AUGUST 29 TO SEPTEMBER 4, 2023



Producers have crossed the half-way point of harvest this week at 51 per cent complete. This is up from 33 per cent last week, ahead of the five-year average (2018-2022) of 34 per cent and the 10-year (2013-2022) of 33 per cent.

The southwest continues to lead harvest progress at 81 per cent complete, this includes an estimated three per cent of all crops being used as a feed source. Harvest in the west central region is also rapidly advancing with 60 per cent of the crop in the bin. The southeast is close to the half-way point at 49 per cent complete. The northwest has made significant progress this week and is now 21 per cent complete.

PROVINCE ADDS 4,600 JOBS OVER LAST YEAR - 2,800 OVER LAST MONTH



Labour Force Hits All-Time High, Unemployment Rate at 5.4 Per Cent

Saskatchewan continues to demonstrate strong labour force growth, with 4,600 new jobs year over year according to newly released labour force figures from Statistics Canada with the labour force climbing to 632,800 an all-time high. Monthly job gains showed 2,800 jobs created, ranking 3rd among the provinces.

“With each month of growth, Saskatchewan gets closer to achieving its Growth Plan goal of adding 100,000 jobs by 2030,” Immigration and Career Training Jeremy Harrison SAID.

“Investment in Saskatchewan is driving our economic growth, but our strong labour force is critical to Saskatchewan’s continued advancement on our goal of making Saskatchewan the best place to live, work and raise a family.”

ROADSIDE INSPECTION OPERATION A GREAT SUCCESS



While many of us were enjoying the last day of the August long weekend, Yorkton-area conservation officers and their law enforcement partners were on the job August 7 at a roadside inspection station, keeping the public safe and protecting Saskatchewan waters from invasive species.

During the multi-agency operation that included the RCMP and Saskatchewan Highway Patrol, 601 vehicles came through the check stop on Highway 10 east of Yorkton. Officers inspected 22 watercraft for aquatic invasive species and decontaminated six boats that were deemed high risk. The successful operation also uncovered a variety of violations, including:

- transporting watercraft with drain plug in place;
- transporting fish that can't be identified;
- driving without a valid licence;
- child restraint and seatbelt violations;
- driving while impaired by cannabis;
- possessing cannabis in a vehicle;
- possessing illicit cigarettes;
- exceeding registered gross vehicle weight; and
- improperly securing cargo.

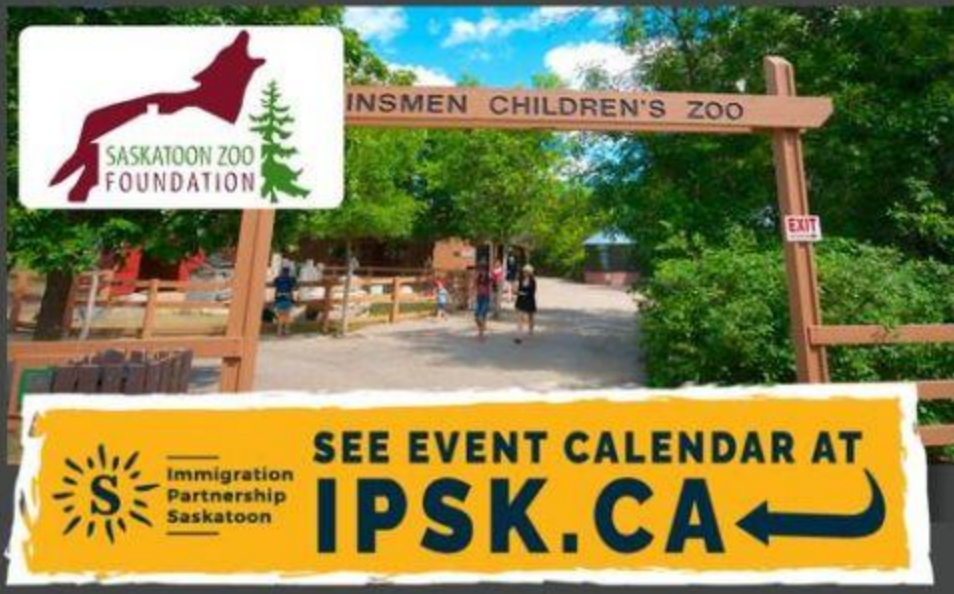
