PREMIER ANNOUNCES SPRING SESSION TO START MARCH 5, BUDGET ON MARCH 21

Premier Brad Wall announced that the spring session of the Legislative Assembly will begin on Monday March 5 with the 2012-13 provincial budget to be delivered on Wednesday, March 21.

Wall said the provincial budget will focus on keeping the government's election commitments while maintaining fiscal responsibility and a balanced budget.

"Saskatchewan's economy is leading the nation," Wall said. "We have a growing population, low unemployment, the second-highest average wages in the country and a great quality of life in our province.

"Saskatchewan people have worked hard to create the Saskatchewan advantage and this budget will be about keeping the Saskatchewan advantage."

Wall said the budget will also provide funding for the government's election commitments, like the new Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship that will provide up to \$2,000 over four years to new high school graduates to reduce the cost of post-secondary tuition in Saskatchewan.

"Saskatchewan already has the best graduate retention program in the country, which gives postsecondary grads all of their tuition back if they choose to stay in Saskatchewan," Wall said. "Now, we want to take the next step by making post-secondary education more affordable through the Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship.

"It's just one step in our plan to keep Saskatchewan moving forward. That's what this upcoming session will be about."

DID YOU KNOW?

- Our campaign promises were designed to ensure that everyone continues to benefit from Saskatchewan's historic growth.
- This year's budget also contains measures that will make life more affordable, such as an expansion to the PST exemption for kids' clothing. This tax change took effect November 15, 2011, and applies to children aged 15 to 17. This means more Saskatchewan families will save 5 per cent on all children's clothing.

- We have also expanded The Active Families Benefit to all children less than 18 years of age. This is an annual refundable tax benefit which helps with the cost of children participating in cultural, recreational, and sport activities. Parents can claim up to \$150 per child.
- Housing affordability is a challenge that our government has been working to solve. To that end we have the new and expanded First Time Home Buyers Tax Credit that came into effect January 1, 2012. This credit will make it easier for people to get into the housing market by providing a provincial non-refundable income tax credit up to \$1,100, to eligible taxpayers. All of these programs help make Saskatchewan the best place in Canada to live.
- One important promise we made was to take further steps to make post-secondary education more accessible and affordable. - The Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship program will provide up to \$2,000 over four years to new high school graduates to reduce the cost of postsecondary tuition in Saskatchewan.
- We already have the best graduate retention program in the country, but it is important we continue taking action to ensure our young people choose Saskatchewan as the place to live, build a career and raise a family.

SASKATCHEWAN ECONOMY OFF TO A STRONG START IN 2012

Leading the Nation in Several Categories

As the first month of 2012 comes to an end, the positive economic news rolled in as job numbers and wholesale trade hit monthly records. Saskatchewan led the nation in growth in wholesale trade, retail sales and non-residential construction. Average weekly earnings increased and unemployment dropped.

"The strong and resilient Saskatchewan economy is providing many job opportunities for people who want to live and work in Saskatchewan," Advanced Education, Employment and Immigration Minister Rob Norris said. "Saskatchewan workers continue to benefit from this economic success with competitive wages, and an unemployment rate that has been dropping."

The number of people employed in Saskatchewan in December 2011 was 523,500, a record for the month of December. When expressed as a percentage of the total labour force population, Saskatchewan has the second fewest number of people receiving EI benefits in Canada at 1.2 per cent. According to a report from Statistics Canada released on January 26, Saskatchewan's average weekly earnings were \$904.42, the second highest in Canada.

Rick Hansen's 25th Anniversary Relay makes its way across the country. The 12,000 kilometer route that retraces Rick's original Man In Motion Tour that began on August 24, 2011 in Cape Spear, NL, is being completed over a nine month-span by 7,000 Canadians who have made a significant difference in the lives of others.

Rick Hansen will be joining a number of these difference makers and will be in Saskatoon on Tuesday, February 7.  is part of the Rick Hansen Institute's Global Spinal Cord Injury Registry. Following a tour of the
 rehab centre, there will be a presentation and photo opportunity at 2:30 pm.

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN EXPANDS HOUSING PROGRAM

To help more municipalities meet housing needs and sustain population and economic growth, the Government of Saskatchewan today announced two funding enhancements to the Encouraging Community Housing Options (ECHO) Program. In total, \$400,000 will be made available to municipalities on a first come, first served basis through the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation.

"Our government recognizes that municipalities across Saskatchewan are facing challenges in addressing housing needs," Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Housing Corporation June Draude said. "The goal of the ECHO program is to provide support for eligible municipalities to develop long-term housing plans that will increase housing supply across the province. We are pleased to implement this program as a key action under our Housing Strategy for Saskatchewan, which was announced in August last year."

THREE ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS RECEIVE GO GREEN FUNDING

The Government of Saskatchewan is providing Go Green funding for three new projects that address the Fund's priority areas of biodiversity, education and awareness, greenhouse gas emissions reduction and water conservation. Additional projects are currently being negotiated for Go Green funding in 2011-12.

"These three projects are indicative of the innovative and cost-effective technologies that are being developed and tested right here in Saskatchewan," Environment Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Over the past four years, the Government of Saskatchewan has committed \$70 million to the Go Green Fund for research and demonstration projects and incentive programs, which achieve real environmental outcomes."
