SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES CLEAN AIR DAY

Canadian Environment Week will be held June 3-9, 2012, and Clean Air Day will be celebrated on June 6. It is an opportunity to recognize the importance of the environment and celebrate the excellent quality of air we have in the province while raising awareness that we should not take them for granted.

Saskatchewan residents can take an active part in helping to reduce air pollution by using public transit, walking, cycling or turning off electronics when not in use. Addressing air quality issues and reducing greenhouse gas emissions will help maintain cleaner air and create a healthier environment for everyone.

"The Government of Saskatchewan is committed to maintaining the high quality of air in Saskatchewan," Environment Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Collaboration and co-operation with municipalities, industry, non-government organizations, and the public and other jurisdictions is the key to successful air management. By ensuring that on-going monitoring activities are conducted, we can accurately measure and manage air quality throughout the province to ensure residents continue to enjoy good quality air."

JOB POSTINGS UP 25 PER CENT ON SASKJOBS.CA

SaskJobs.ca continues to help workers and families connect to new opportunities in Saskatchewan.

There were 16,779 jobs posted on the site in May, a 25 per cent increase compared to a year ago. More than half of all the jobs posted in May were full time positions and that trend continues to move upward.

"Saskatchewan's strong economy is attracting people from across Canada and around the world," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "With jobs available in more than 350 communities, there are opportunities for people in every corner of our province."

SASKATCHEWAN'S AVERAGE WAGE HITS HIGHEST LEVEL EVER

Saskatchewan's average weekly earnings reached an all-time high of \$918.15 in March 2012 according to Statistics Canada.

Saskatchewan's 5.9 per cent jump in average wages from a year ago was the highest among all provinces and well above the national increase of 2.1 per cent. Saskatchewan's \$51.50 increase was almost three times as high as the \$17.91 national increase.

"More people are working in Saskatchewan than ever before," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "Better jobs, better wages. This is all part of the Saskatchewan Advantage."

SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT

Summer is fast approaching and youth in the province, 14 and 15 year-olds, who are interested in summer jobs, must complete Saskatchewan's Young Worker Readiness Certificate Course (YWRCC) in order to work.

The course teaches youth about their rights and responsibilities, hazards in the workplace and provides occupational health and safety information.

"This course is critical for helping youth to gain information that will enable them to safely engage in the workplace," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "Youth and new workers experience higher rates of injuries, so we want to make sure they have the opportunity to learn about health and safety practices."

MEEWASIN OPENS SASKENEGY BEAVER POND

Tuesday, June 5, 2012, Meewasin opened the SaskEnergy Beaver Pond room at Beaver Creek Conservation Area. Established in 1979, Beaver Creek Conservation Area is located 13 km south of Saskatoon off of Highway #219. The Interpretive Center officially opened in 1984. Considered a

microcosm of the Meewasin Valley, BCCA offers educational programs that provide visitors with opportunities to discover nature along a selection of trails winding through prairie, forest, dune, creek and valley habitats. In June 2010 heavy rain caused a flood which ultimately destroyed the interpretive beaver room. A major donation from SaskEnergy allowed Meewasin to rebuild the room as an interpretive beaver pond, as well as provide an accessible stair climber, an interpretive web cam and a 600 metre accessible trail from the interpretive centre to overlook Beaver Creek.

TIM HORTONS CAMP DAY JUNE 6

Tim Hortons Camp Day is a time each year where every Tim Hortons restaurant owner donates all of their coffee sales from that day to the "Tim Hortons Children's Foundation". I had the privilege of joining owner Dale Martin at the Attridge Drive location to serve coffee.

COLD A LONG TIME

Duncan MacPherson, was a talented Saskatoon hockey player who played junior hockey with the North Battle Barons (1981-82) and the Saskatoon Blades (1982-86); he was ultimately drafted by the New York Islanders. When his contract with New York was not renewed in 1989, he went on a brief tour of Europe and vanished without a trace.

His parents spent fourteen years looking for their son. Fourteen years later, Duncan's body was found at a popular ski resort in Austria. There was never a proper investigation to find out what happened to their son, in order to help heal, they enlisted author John Leake to help with their ongoing search for answers.

Cold a Long Time: An Alpine Mystery, is the book that has come out of this search. Congratulations Mr. Leake and Lynda and Bob MacPherson, Duncan's parents, on the Independent Publisher Award the book has won as well as top seller at McNally Robinson for the past four months.

I encourage everyone to purchase the book and keep the memory of Duncan MacPherson alive.

SASKATCHEWAN ORDER OF MERIT – HONOURING CITIZENS

Do you know someone who has enriched the lives of others and helped build a better society? These individuals deserve to be recognized for their achievements and contributions to the social, cultural, and economic well-being of the province and its residence.

Nominating an individual to the Saskatchewan Order of Merit is an appropriate way to say "thank-you" to someone who has worked to create a promising future for Saskatchewan people. The Saskatchewan Order of Merit is the province's highest honour.

Canadian citizens who are current or former long-term residents of Saskatchewan are eligible for nomination. These talented and deserving individuals may come from all walks of life and from many different backgrounds. The fields of endeavor recognized by this honour include the arts; agriculture; business and industry; community leadership; occupations or professions; public service; research; sport and recreation; and community service.

The only exceptions to eligibility for nominations are presently-serving members of Parliament or the Legislature and members of the judiciary. Posthumous nomination may be accepted within one year of the death of the nominee. Honourary membership in the Order can also be granted to distinguished persons who are not Canadian citizens or residents of Saskatchewan.

Any person or organization can nominate someone they feel is deserving of the Saskatchewan Order of Merit. Although nominations are accepted at any time during the year, July 5th is the deadline for nominations to be considered this year.
