STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS



I was pleased to be present at Mayor Don Atchison's 10th State of the City Address. Mayor Atchison focused on his three Ps: People, Pavement, and Progress. As our city grows through immigration, people moving home, or people coming to take advantage of our growing economy, Mayor Atchison touts plans for Saskatoon's north downtown. Some of the most innovative neighbourhoods in Canada are in the planning stages for the area. He has set a goal to have 10% of the city's population living downtown and working in the central business area. At this time only 3000 people live downtown. As tax incentives have helped, what Mayor Atchison wants to see is more done in the way of tax breaks.

Mayor Atchison stressed the growth of the city by using the example of record breaking building permits in 2012. This kind of growth does come with challenges and one major challenge has become traffic. Mayor Atchison said the north commuter bridge will be six lanes to help with congestion in the city's north end. Atchison made it clear that although the city is looking at major projects in the future, Saskatoon's core neighbourhoods would not be left behind.

SCHOOL YEAR BECOMES UNIFORM ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN

All Saskatchewan students will receive more consistent face-to-face, instructional time in schools starting this fall. Legislative and regulatory amendments that set instructional hours in a school year at 950 were proclaimed on January 1, 2013. The changes will apply to the 2013-14 school year.

"We have been working with our stakeholders for the past year on these changes," Education Minister Russ Marchuk said. "These changes will help to ensure all Saskatchewan students benefit from more consistent instructional hours and will bring us in line with our western Canadian counterparts."

Following consultation, a minimum of 950 instructional hours was chosen to be the standard as there was a variance of approximately 30 hours between schools divisions. This move is also consistent with other provinces.

56 RESIDENTS RECEIVE THE QUEEN'S DIAMOND JUBILEE MEDAL



I had the honour of attending the final presentation ceremony of the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal. Lieutenant Governor Vaughn Solomon Schofield and Provincial Secretary Wayne Elhard presented another 56 Saskatchewan residents with the medals on Monday, January 21.

When the Queen's Diamond Jubuilee began in February 2012, 60,000 medals were created by the Canadian Mint to be awarded to recipients across the country.

Tim Gitzel, a Saskatoon Silver Springs constituent was honoured at the ceremony. Other constituents Michael Morrissey and Liza Kook were also recipients of the medals along with my good friend and mentor, Merle Sawatsky.

It was wonderful to see so many people from our province honoured with the Queen's Diamond

Jubilee Medal. Congratulations to all of the worthy recipients and for everything they have done to make Saskatchewan such a wonderful province to work, live and raise a family.

SASKATCHEWAN RETAILERS BUSY IN NOVEMBER WITH RECORD SALES

November was a record month for retail trade in Saskatchewan and sales totaled \$1.48 billion. Saskatchewan ranked third among provinces with a percentage increase on year-over-year and on a monthly basis, according to Statistics Canada.

"There are a number of issues at play here, including a strong and diverse Saskatchewan economy, more people living and working here, and increases in average weekly earnings that are responsible for the growth in retail sales," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "That's good news for our vibrant retail sector, and is really important in keeping our economy moving forward."

PROPERTY VALUES INCREASE DRAMATICALLY IN SASKATCHEWAN

The overall value of property in Saskatchewan has increased by 67 per cent over the past four years as Saskatchewan's population and economy continue to grow.

Overall, the assessment of property in Saskatchewan has grown from \$58 billion in 2009 to \$97 billion in the 2013 revaluation year.

"This huge increase shows the strength of Saskatchewan's economy," Government Relations Minister Jim Reiter said. "If you own property in Saskatchewan, chances are it is worth a lot more than it was just four years ago and you will see that reflected in your property assessment notice."

- Saskatchewan non-profit entities, charitable organizations, and cultural groups are eligible to apply for funding through the Community Initiatives Fund
- The Community Initiatives Fund is a Special Purpose Fund created through the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation Act and is accountable to the Ministry of Parks, Culture, and Sport
- The Fund is funded through portion of the Regina and Moose Jaw casino profits and governed by a board of eight members
- As of December 2012, almost \$3.33 million in grants have been given to help renew its commitments to Saskatchewan communities
