CHILDRENS' HOSPITAL ANNOUNCEMENT



On Friday, November 9, Conexus Credit Union announced a provincial matching fund program to help raise funds for the Children's Hospital Foundation of Saskatchewan. RECOGNITION OF A GROWING ECONOMY

In a recent report done by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, the strength of Saskatchewan's economy emanated. According to the company, the first 10 months of 2012 were very good in terms of new home construction. Construction was started on more than 6,300 new housing units between January 1 and October 31, up from about 4,700 over the same period of 2011.

This is yet another example of how the benefits of growth improves the lives for all Saskatchewan people.





Thursday, November 15, it was a pleasure to bring greetings on behalf of Premier Brad Wall and the Government of Saskatchewan as IPAC-CO2 announced the world's first Bi-National Standard for Geological Storage of Carbon Dioxide. This announcement confirms Saskatchewan as a world leader in international standards and environmental protection. The Bi-National Standard creates a consistent process for the geological storage of carbon dioxide. This supports the province's growth plan as carbon capture and storage technology allows us to meet our greenhouse gas emission targets while continuing to use coal to generate electricity and minimize costs to the consumer. IPAC-CO2, as well as the Canadian Standards Association, have put countless hours into the development of this plan and should be commended for their hard work!

NEW RENTAL LEGISLATION MEANS CHANGES FOR SENIORS, LANDLORDS, AND FIXED-TERM TENANCIES

The Government of Saskatchewan is enhancing the rights of seniors and providing additional protection for tenants.

Amendments to *The Residential Tenancies Regulations, 2007,* will among other things, provide seniors residing in independent living facilities with the right to use the Office of Residential Tenancies to resolve disputes. This comes into effect on April 1, 2013.

"Seniors' independent living facilities are exempt from the current law and we could see no reason for that," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "This change puts them on equal footing with other rental properties."

Saskatchewan's manufacturing shipments set a new record for the month of September, according to figures released today by Statistics Canada.

Saskatchewan had the highest percentage increase in the nation on a year-over-year basis, up by 7.7 per cent. Nationally, figures were up only 1.8 per cent.

"The manufacturing sector is very important to our province's economic growth," Economy

Minister Bill Boyd said. "Saskatchewan has a thriving manufacturing sector which creates quality products to supply consumers across the globe."
