SASKATCHEWAN PLAN FOR GROWTH

It was another exciting day in Saskatchewan as Premier Brad Wall delivered the "**State of the Province Address**" at the Chamber of Commerce luncheon. The Premier shared his thoughts on continuing the momentum of our province beyond 2012.

Premier Wall released the Saskatchewan Plan for Growth. The Premier is setting a goal of 1.2M people living in Saskatchewan by 2020, outlining our government's roadmap for getting there and emphasizing that improved quality of life in Saskatchewan is the purpose of growth. The six core activities the government can undertake to foster continued growth are:

- Investing in infrastructure:
- Developing a skilled workforce;
- Ensuring competitiveness;
- Increasing export trade;
- Advancing the province's natural resource strengths through innovation; and
- Maintaining sound fiscal management.

Additional highlights include:

- The government will invest at least \$2.5B in infrastructure over the next three budgets in addition to an immediate commitment of \$150M to establish the new SaskBuilds Fund.
- Provincial debt will be reduced by another \$400M by 2017.
- The new Saskatchewan Heritage Initiative will provide guidance on how to best utilize Saskatchewan's non-renewable resource revenue once the province's debt has been retired.
- The corporate business tax rate will be lowered from 12 to 10% by 2015.

KEEPING PROMISES - STREAMLINING OUR HEALTH SERVICES

The province is using innovative technology as part of lean process improvements to enhance patient access to hospital services in Regina and Saskatoon.

New bed-management software being implemented in Saskatchewan's two largest centres will help reduce congestion in hospitals and improve access to inpatient services. The software is expected to help reduce surgical wait times, and encourage better flow through clogged emergency rooms.

The new tool will enable hospitals in Saskatoon and Regina to track inpatient needs in real time, matching patient needs with bed availability and automatically notifying staff when rooms need to be cleaned for a new patient. The procurement process undertaken will allow hospitals in other Saskatchewan communities to implement bed management software as they become ready to install it in the future. This same approach to improve patient care has been successful in other provinces and the United States.

"This software will increase hospitals' capacity to serve patients promptly," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "This is one strategy, along with lean and others that are being taken to address bed flow and availability. Each day, our hospitals will be able to admit more patients for surgeries and other procedures, and relieve some of the pressure in emergency departments that get congested with patients waiting for a room. We anticipate this will be another mechanism to help us achieve our Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative goal of no patient waiting longer than three months for surgery by 2014."

STARS OPENS ITS DOORS IN SASKATOON

STARS Air Ambulance opened its doors Monday October 15, in Saskatoon. The temporary location at the John Diefenbaker International Airport will be the second base in the province and will be able to better serve the people of Saskatchewan.

Because the first hour after injury is critical, STARS has unveiled the BK-117, a red helicopter that will be able to travel the province to get to accidents in more remote areas more quickly therefore preventing more fatalities.

PotashCorp has donated \$27 million to the project which will include a permanent location by late 2013 and a bigger helicopter sometime down the road.

100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS



On October 11, the Legislative Building officially celebrated its past. The Governor General of Canada, David Johnson, was able to be in attendance for the anniversary. The ceremonies reminded everyone of the power and importance of democracy in our province. "The Legislative Building is a symbol of democracy representing our collective values and remains the center piece of government a century after it was built," Minister responsible for the Provincial Capital Commission Kevin Doherty said. "I hope that people across Saskatchewan will join us in celebrating this significant building and momentous occasion."

The long awaited unveiling of articles to be sealed in the time capsule were also released. The time capsule will be opened in 2112 and will represent life in Saskatchewan today. "The 2012 time capsule represents today's Saskatchewan: a province that is growing, that has a strong economy and that is filled with optimism," Doherty said. "It shows the vision and the spirit of the people as we look forward to the future."
