HONOURING SYLVIA FEDORUK

I join Premier Brad Wall and the Government of Saskatchewan, as we express our condolences on the passing of a great Saskatchewanian, former Lieutenant Governor Sylvia Fedoruk, to her family and friends.

"Sylvia Fedoruk was the embodiment of Saskatchewan innovation and spirit and an inspiration to all she met," Wall said. "In March of 2011, I had the great honour of chatting with Dr. Fedoruk at the launch of the University of Saskatchewan's Canadian Centre for Nuclear Innovation. She reminded me of the history of nuclear medicine in Saskatchewan of which she was a pioneer."

Sylvia Fedoruk was the first woman to be named Lieutenant Governor in Saskatchewan, serving from 1988 through 1994.

"I join Her Honour and current Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, Vaughn Solomon Schofield in offering my condolences to Dr. Fedoruk's family and friends," Wall said.

SASKATCHEWAN GROWING AT FASTEST PACE IN OVER 90 YEARS

Saskatchewan's population grew by 22,154 people between July 1, 2011 and July 1, 2012, according to the latest figures released today by Statistics Canada. That's the most growth in a single year since 1921. There were 1,079,958 people living in Saskatchewan as of July 1, 2012.

In the most recent quarter April 1 to July 1, 2012, Saskatchewan's population grew by 6,851 - the largest increase in a single quarter since Statistics Canada started keeping quarterly records in 1971.

Premier Brad Wall said the latest figures show Saskatchewan is on the right track with one of the strongest economies in Canada.

"Saskatchewan is growing at its fastest pace since the earliest days of our province," Wall said. "Next month, we will be releasing our growth plan designed to ensure this growth continues and that we are meeting both the challenges and opportunities of growth in the years ahead."

SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES NATIONAL FOREST WEEK AND TREE DAY

National Forest Week, from September 23 to 29 this year, is a time to celebrate the many ways that forests contribute to our quality of life. "Although the most recognizable prairie image may be that of our grain fields, more than half of Saskatchewan is forest," Environment Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Our majestic boreal forest plays an important part of our province's history, culture and economy."

"Many Saskatchewan communities, families and individuals depend on forests for recreation and spiritual renewal, as well as their livelihood," Cheveldayoff said. "Although this is National Forest Week, I encourage all Saskatchewan residents to explore our province's northern forest throughout the year ahead."

MOOSE MOUNTAIN DAM RECEIVES \$1.7 MILLION REHABILITATION


Building on the Government of Saskatchewan's commitment to infrastructure investment, the Saskatchewan Watershed Authority will spend \$1.74 million to rehabilitate Moose Mountain Dam, northeast of Weyburn in the Souris River Watershed.

"Maintaining our water infrastructure is key to our government's vision for resource management in Saskatchewan," Minister responsible for the Saskatchewan Watershed Authority Ken Cheveldayoff said. "This investment will help safeguard the health, safety and reliability of this watershed now and in the years to come."

THE NEW R-2000 STANDARD FOR HOME BUILDING

The R-2000 building standard was recently updated to reflect a higher level of energy efficiency that will serve to encourage and lead the building industry to construct the next generation of houses. The program was first introduced in the mid-80s, and the original R-2000 program served to demonstrate the



state-of-the-art-design and construction techniques for energy efficiency that have now become the basis of Canada's Energy Codes. The R-2000 standard has elevated the level of environmental and energy efficiency construction techniques for leading edge home builders and their customers.

On September 18, the first home built to the new R-2000 standards in western Canada was unveiled and occupied. Dr. Geoff Waters of the Department of Environment was able to attend the ribbon cutting on behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan and the Ministry of

Environment. Standards like these are important to improving our environmental footprint and helping keep our homes efficient.
